## **IV** Drug Treatment Centre

- The Drug Treatment Court of Vancouver is moving from Downtown to Main Street, above the Salvation Army. The program is an alternative to jail for some individuals and it is a non-residential treatment centre. There are approximately 80 participants, but only 55 at one time. The site is operated by corrections staff and medical professionals.
- There are very strict requirements for admittance, such as no history of violence, and must abstain from drugs and other restrictions. Contact information for the site will be provided to Darwyn and police will be actively involved as well. There will be an open house in the fall and invitation swill be sent out.

#### Park Board Commissioner's Report

Park Board had a meeting on March 12<sup>th</sup> and there were a lot discussion regarding Kits Beach and the bike path. People are anxious to have this resolved. More information as to cost and the amount of tree loss has been requested.

- Mayor moved a motion to ask Park Board to consider replacing parts of the Langara golf course into greenspace. Golfers pay into a fund that is for improving drainage on the course. The motion was passed by the Councillors for Park Board to consider the possibilities.
- Still Creek Community Garden is being relocated to add modular housing. New space will move into Slocan Park.
- There are about 50 herons that have come back to their nests in Stanley Park, There are cameras available for the public to have a close look at the colony.
- There will be a new park developed in Oakridge. The builder is anxious to move forward with the construction of the site. The new community centre will be facing 41<sup>st</sup> avenue and will be available to the public to access between dawn to dusk.
- VanSplash hasn't been brought back to the meeting yet, but it should be back before summer.

### **VII Committee Reports**

#### A. Childcare Committee

- The Provincial Government has announced two child care initiatives starting this year, the Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative and the Affordable Child Care Benefit.
- The Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative is an opt in program and an application needs to be submitted for approval. This initiative provides a reduction of \$350/month for all children in licensed infant and toddler programs and \$100/month for all children in licensed 3-5 group care programs. Providers must make a commitment that fees would not be increased unless in a special circumstance. In addition, information on previous fee increases must be included as well with the application

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the MPCCA opt into the Provincial Childcare Fee Reduction Initiative.

#### **CARRIED**

- The second initiative, Affordable Child care benefit, will be replacing the current Child Care Subsidy program. The changeover would make more families eligible to receive child care subsidy. Families with less than \$45000 family income would receive free child care and those earning between \$60000 and \$80000 would be \$10 per day.
- A motion is presented by Gary regarding the assessment of the replacement value for the Our House structure. Members have highlighted that personal home insurance does not require any assessments, but understands that it may be different for commercial buildings. Alex is interested into whether appraises can be completed by outside sources.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT an assessment of the replacement value, for insurance purposes, be performed for the Our House structure and that \$1500 be allocated for this purpose.

- A new budget has been sent to Lily by the artist. The budget to cast the statue is \$50000, but to have it installed would bring the total to \$75000. Fundraising has stalled, but Roughly \$42000 has been collected so far.
- Clarification regarding the 1% ActiveNet fee and the Community Investment Fund was asked by the bookkeeper. The ActiveNet fee of 1% has always been in effect since Park Board started using the system. The Community Investment Fund, which is 0% for this year, but it will be 1% for next year and 2% the following year.
- The CAC meeting was held on March 4th. There were 13 Associations in attendance, which included some that haven't signed the JOA yet. The meeting was to follow up on the JOA requirement to have semi-annual meetings on issues.
- The Variety Van is now at Coastal Ford. The proceeds from the sale of the vehicle will be divided between MPCCA and Variety Children's Charity.

# F. Program Committee

The previous Artist in Communities program was a success with Sarah Van Borek's Upcycled project. Thomas would like to know where the Upcycled Stories project is at and the status on the film that was produced. There is an opportunity to partake in the AIC program again.
